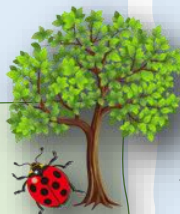

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Good news! Kent County Council is lending its support to local school plan

Dear Parents

We write with the good news that the Support Weald Schooling campaign to restore a non-selective secondary school in the Weald has taken a SIGNIFICANT STEP FORWARD with Kent County Council pledging its support.

Following a most encouraging meeting with Beverley Fordham, Leader of KCC's Education and Skills Committee, Nick Abrahams, Assistant Director of Education for West Kent and Claudine Russell, our local county councillor, we have been offered their guidance to shape a proposal to restore a non-selective secondary school to serve children in the Weald.

This proposal will explain our plan to open a smaller school annexed to an existing school that shares our vision of offering truly inclusive, community-based education enabling children to live and learn locally.

If successful in restoring a small, non-selective secondary local school in the Weald, we can:

- Combat the very high level of absenteeism we are currently seeing
- Reduce children's travel times to school
- Provide an alternative to very large schools for those who prefer this
- Offer a range of academic and vocational education pathways for children to make the most of their different talents and interests.
- Reintegrate home-schooled children into mainstream schooling- with all the educational, social and community benefits this brings
- Restore community values to our rural villages
- Give children a sense of belonging as they live, learn and socialise locally

We still have a long way to go but remain steadfast in our commitment. Your support of our campaign is what drives us. Your concerns and voices are being heard and will continue to be vital to creating a viable proposal.
