Our Agreed consistencies for English are:

- We will follow the recommended books from Power of Reading.
- All classes will be set up with a reading area.
- All children will be encouraged to participate with the spelling homework.
- Children will be given opportunities to edit and improve their work.

In our English curriculum you will see that we value inclusion and diversity:

Learning opportunities will be matched to the needs of children with learning difficulties and take into account any arrangements from their SEND support plans to allow children to learn key reading and writing skills.

British Values and Spiritual, Moral, Social and Cultural Learning (SMSC) in English:

Social: Children look for reading and writing opportunities in the wider community and further afield (summer reading challenge / Rotary writing competitions). They are encouraged to join a school book club and to become reading ambassadors where they can work with children from other year groups.

Moral: Children are encouraged to discuss and create their own opinions on different books and texts and to be considerate when someone else has a different opinion.

Cultural: Children study literature by authors from a range of backgrounds and cultures as well as texts depicting a range of cultures.
